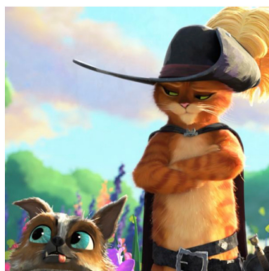


5 fun ideas for half term!

From family dining to virtual reality, we've got plenty of ways to keep the kids happy this half term! Here are our top 5...

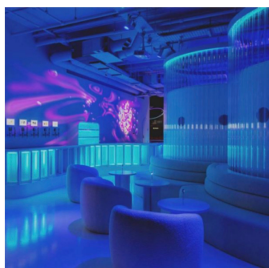


A day at the flicks!
